

Blood Borne Pathogen Training Requirements

Section 119307

- (a) Evidence of Body Art related blood borne pathogen training within past year.
- (b) Owner shall provide training that meets standards for all employees, contractors, and volunteers who perform duties within the decontamination and sterilization or procedure area.
- (c) The training shall meet all of the following criteria:
 - 1) Be conducted by a person who is knowledgeable in exposure control and infection prevention in the body art setting.
 - 2) Training and materials shall be specific to performing body art.
 - 3) Shall be at least two hours in length and include:
 - A. A copy and explanation of the Cal OSHA Blood borne Pathogens Standard
 - B. Any local requirements
 - C. Discussion of transmission, control, and symptoms of diseases
 - D. Tasks involved in performing art and how they may lead to exposure
 - E. Types and uses of personal protective equipment, including limitations of equipment
 - F. Tasks, techniques, personal protective equipment (PPE), issues involved
 - G. Importance and demonstration of hand hygiene
 - H. Choice, use and storage of disinfectants and antiseptics
 - I. Signage for biohazard materials and importance of proper labeling on chemicals and supplies
 - J. Hepatitis B information
 - K. Discussion of what constitutes a BBP exposure incident including:
 - i. Examples of BBP exposure, how it occurred, and how to prevent or minimize in future
 - ii. Risk of infection following incident
 - iii. Procedures to be followed after an incident
 - L. Opportunities for interactive questions and answers with the instructor
- (d) Every person required to do the training must complete a two hour update annually.
- (e) Records shall be maintained for three years and provided upon request
